Dear Senators Warren and Blumenthal,

Thank you for your letter. As Mark Zuckerberg [recently](#) stated, there is no Meta-issued stablecoin, and we currently have no plans to issue a stablecoin in the future.

Meta currently supports over 50 currencies in more than 100 countries, digital wallets, instant account-to-account payments, debit and credit cards, as well as local payment methods specific to certain countries. Meta is interested in potentially enabling the use of non-Meta stablecoins for payments to people, businesses and creators, should they choose to get paid that way. As we currently do, our approach would include leveraging the infrastructure and services of trusted third-party payment platforms, allowing us to enhance and expand our suite of solutions through partnerships rather than developing or issuing proprietary payment options.

We routinely seek to improve our payment solutions and strive to offer the most relevant payment methods to the people and businesses using our services. To achieve this, we regularly engage with financial services companies, including global payment networks, payment processors, digital wallet providers, and other financial technology experts. This approach ensures that we offer users a comprehensive suite of payment processing and financial infrastructure solutions. As part of these ongoing efforts, we have engaged with some of these companies to evaluate the capabilities of various widely-used stablecoins and to explore potential use cases, such as facilitating payouts to creators in markets where currencies are volatile.

Meta has not lobbied on behalf of any of the pieces of legislation you reference in your letter. As it relates to lobbying by trade associations, we note that Meta belongs to various trade groups and organizations representing a spectrum of views and communities. We did not engage with any of our trade associations on stablecoin legislation, and we respectfully refer you to those associations for more details on their lobbying activities. We note that we do not always agree with every policy or position that individual organizations or their leadership take. Therefore, our membership, work with organizations, or event support should not be viewed as an endorsement of any particular organization or policy.
